### Present in Egypt since 1976

Inspired by its general aims to promote democracy and social justice, to support economic and social development, as well as to advocate for human rights and gender equality, the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (FES) started working in Egypt in 1976. The office operates in cooperation with local partners within the framework of an agreement with the Egyptian government. This agreement was endorsed by Presidential Decree 139/1976 and by the Egyptian parliament. The agreement was renewed in 1988, endorsed by Presidential Decree 244/1989 and approved by the Egyptian parliament.



The Egyptian uprising of February 2011 was driven by demands for profound social and political change. Responding to these aspirations will be the main challenge for stakeholders and the whole of Egyptian society during the coming years. FES is ready to assist the Egyptian people during this transition process.

## Fields of work of The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung in Egypt

The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung cooperates with Egyptian partners through conferences, seminars, training programs and workshops, academic research, discussion forums and exchange of experience in the following fields:



In the field of environment, the FES's objective is to support environmental policies, to raise environmental awareness, and to promote the exchange of information and experiences on a national and regional level by supporting non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to realize projects which contribute to raising environmental awareness. The FES also cooperates in the implementation of initiatives and pilot projects aiming at establishing environmental sustainability. The FES Egypt also cooperates regionally with other FES offices in the Middle East and North Africa on sustainable energy policy with a particular focus on renewable energies.



The FES cooperates with governmental and nongovernmental organizations that contribute to sociopolitical discourse in order to achieve social justice, reduce the gap between the different social classes, and realize social democratic principles to balance and stabilize society. It also aims to encourage a constructive tripartite social dialogue in Egypt.

### Empowerment of youth and women

Special attention is given to the participation of young people in our activities. Therefore, the FES cooperates with different faculties in Egyptian universities to promote civic education programs for students.



Aiming to empower women and strengthen their role in Egyptian society, the FES provides activities in different relevant fields and is working in cooperation with e.g. research centers, university faculties, and NGOs to increase women's participation in public life. Furthermore, the FES seeks to strengthen the legal status of women and to reduce gender discrimination.
